Park up in Priory car park and enjoy a stroll around the park and duck pond. Or perhaps you'd prefer to pop into town for breakfast or coffee in one of our many cafes.

After a stroll around the historic town of Bodmin (various Town Trails available please ask) wander up St Nicholas Street to the Bodmin and Wenford Railway and take the 11.00 train to Boscarne Junction. (June-Sept please check timetable for rest of year)

Return to Bodmin, on foot, via the Camel Trail, which is the bed of what was once the Bodmin to Padstow railway track. Walk distance: 2.3 miles.

En-route you will pass The Borough Arms a local St Austell Brewery Inn with real ale and food available.

Continue along the trail, passing the infamous Jail (1779 – 1916) back into town.

Wander around the Bodmin Museum or St Petroc's Church, or enjoy one of the hourly showings in the Courtroom Experience at The Shire Hall.
