

How to get there

The 529 bus leaves Bodmin town hourly for Bodmin Parkway, where you catch a train to Liskeard, then change onto the scenic Looe branch line

Things to do

Spend a lazy afternoon on the town beach

Watch fish being landed and auctioned at the fish market

Buy fresh shell fish to eat around the harbour

Fish off the harbour wall

Eat lunch in one of the many restaurants or cafes

Go out on a boat trip, either for pleasure or fishing for mackerel or shark

Take a boat trip to Looe Island

Visit the Guildhall Museum

Take a leisurely walk along the coastal path – east to the Monkey Sanctuary or west to Talland Bay

Wander around the Living from the Sea exhibition and Discovery Centre

Take a guided tour around the narrow streets and courtyards

Decorate your own ceramic pottery at 'Paint a Pot'

Spend an afternoon strolling around the gift shops

Spot some birds on a walk up the west bank of the West Looe River, through Kilminorth Wood
