

How to get there

The 529 bus leaves Bodmin town hourly for St Austell, where you change for the 26 First service to Mevagissey, or the 526 to Heligan.

It is also possible to walk from Mevagissey to Heligan - alight by Mevagissey sports centre and walk along the cycle track following signs to "The Lost Gardens of Heligan". (2.5 miles return trip)

Things to do in Mevagissey

Wander around the narrow streets and unusual gift shops

Fish off the harbour wall

Watch the fishermen land their catch as you laze around the harbour side

Visit the World Model Railways Exhibition

Stroll around the aquarium

Sit on the harbour side and eat fish and chips but beware of the sea gulls

Have a cream tea in one of the many harbour side cafes

Catch the Mevagissey to Fowey ferry (weather permitting) and visit both towns in one day.
