

## How to get there

The 593 bus leaves Bodmin hourly for Liskeard but only one bus per day goes from Liskeard to Minions (the 574 at 10:30, leaving Minions at 14:50 Mon – Sat)

## Things to do

With approximately 4 hours to spend in Minions:-

Take a walk across the Moor through the Hurler's stone circles and on to the Cheesewring (ask for details of a 4 mile walk researched and written up by the Shire Hall staff)

Visit the renovated engine house that is now the Minions Heritage Centre, a small museum of local mining and archaeology (free entry)

Wander up to Caradon Hill where you will find a wealth of prehistoric barrows

Stop at Hurlers Halt tea rooms for a light lunch, ice cream or cream tea

Pop into the Cheesewring Hotel for a pint

The last bus leaves Liskeard at 18:30 so why not explore this ancient stannary and market town before rushing back to Bodmin

**NOTE:** *When walking around Bodmin Moor it is advisable to wear suitable footwear and take an ordnance survey map and compass in case of inclement weather.*
