

How to get there

The 555 bus leaves Bodmin town hourly for Wadebridge, where you change for the 594 service

Things to do - Tintagel

Visit the Old Post Office, a NT property with a famous uneven slate roof

Take an exhilarating walk around the 13th Century Tintagel Castle, possibly the birthplace of King Arthur

Visit King Arthur's Great Halls with its interactive show

Sit a while in Trevena Square, a product of the Tintagel Regeneration Project

Walk the 4 miles from Tintagel to Boscastle along a stunning stretch of the SW coast path with spectacular views and great birdlife – seabirds are in abundance whilst peregrine falcons breed on the cliffs.

Take a brief detour up the mysterious 'Rocky Valley' with its bronze age maze carvings. Tie a ribbon above the carvings and make a wish

Things to do - Boscastle

Visit The Witchcraft Museum for a fascinating insight into ancient and modern witchcraft and paganism

Stroll down to the distinctive harbour, sit on the quay and admire the view

Enjoy a cream tea or Cornish pasty in one of the many tea shops, pubs and cafes

Take a relaxing stroll up the Valency valley, enjoying the peace and tranquillity of the ancient woodland and bubbling brook

See how the regeneration is progressing after the 2004 flood
