Leaflet 1 (town & steam train)

Park up in Priory car park and enjoy a stroll around the park and duck pond. Or perhaps you'd prefer to pop into town for breakfast or coffee in one of our many cafes.

After a stroll around the historic town of Bodmin wander up St Nicholas Street to the Bodmin and Wenford Railway and take the 11.00 train to Boscarne Junction. ☎ 0845 125 9678 www.bodminandwenfordrailway.co.uk

Return to Bodmin, on foot, via the Camel Trail, which is the bed of what was once the Bodmin to Padstow railway track. Walk distance: 2.3 miles.

En-route you will pass The Borough Arms which is open all day.

Continue along the trail, passing the infamous Jail (1779 – 1916), back into town.

Wander around the Bodmin Museum or St Petroc's Church, or enjoy a performance of the Courtroom Experience at The Shire Hall. ☎ 01208 76616 www.bodminlive.com . This is a re-enactment of an infamous murder trial that took place in The Shire Hall in 1844.

Whilst in The Shire Hall, pop into the Visitor Centre where we welcome browsers to our well-stocked shop.

Round off a pleasant day by taking a stroll up to the Beacon to watch the sun set over the Cornish countryside.
